How many places & how many hours do we spend waiting for someone or something to happen?

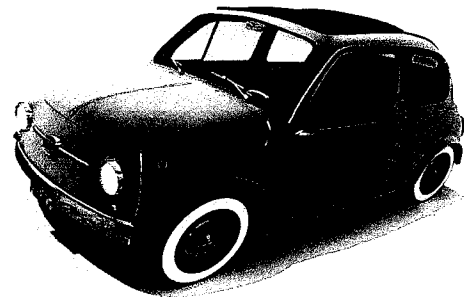
You are not alone! Many other people do the same each and every day.
