1	<p>Districts / DRs have important roles. These include signing the AMIAS application, signing annual recertification form, maintaining AMIAS training records, and being a person to call if you suspect abuse or violations of our Area Safety and Behavioral Requirements.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
2	<p>As an AMIAS, you can serve as a personal sponsor to Alateens.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
3	<p>You <u>cannot</u> take an Alateen to an event outside our Area unless the Area has pre-approved it. Example: North Florida Area Alateen Conference.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
4	<p>Alateen meetings are generally closed except for an occasional “open” meeting to celebrate an anniversary or for outreach purposes. Closed means only Alateens and certified AMIAS can attend. 5	<p>You <u>should</u> consult the Area Alateen Coordinator and your District Representative (DR) if you want to start a new group. But the paperwork for a new group goes to the Alateen Process Person (AAPP). He / she is your contact to register a new group, reactivate a group, update an Alateen group registration, and confirm AMIAS certification status before an event.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
6	<p>An Alateen shares information with you about problems with her mother. The mother says she knows you can make suggestions of how she can help her daughter. 7	<p>The FL legal definition of abuse is “any physical, mental or sexual injury or harm that causes or is likely to cause the child’s physical, mental or emotional health to be significantly impaired.....”</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
8	<p>During events when the Alateens are in the care of the AMIAS for the entire event, such as the Alateen Conference, the AMIAS is responsible for the safety and behavior of the Alateens 24/7.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
9	<p>In accordance with Florida law, if as a result of an Alateen sharing, I have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is abused, abandoned, or neglected by a parent, legal custodian, caregiver, or other person responsible for the child's welfare, I should report the allegation to the FL Abuse Hotline.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
10	<p>To verify the information I need to gather to make a report of suspected child abuse, abandonment or neglect, I can consult the Area Alateen Coordinator. 14	<p>It is not necessary to confirm the AMIAS' active status before an event – they have a WSO ID# and this is sufficient.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
15	<p>When an event has an Alateen component, such as the Area Convention, the parent / guardian who brought them to the event is responsible for them, except for the period of time when the Alateen is participating in an Alateen function.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
16	<p>The <u>appropriate</u> Travel and Medical Release form must be notarized because it gives authority to provide emergency medical treatment to an Alateen at an event. Also, when teens are transported by an AMIAS, the Alateen must be in the care of certified members at all times during the event.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>

21	<p>Alateen groups should set “Behavioral Guidelines.” When the Alateen group determines its guidelines and the process for dealing with problems, the group members will monitor their own behavior. (Example: use of cell phones, how the meeting is run, interrupting each other, use of foul language, etc)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
22	<p>It is appropriate to assure Alateens understand the anonymity concept, but you should let them know that if they talk about hurting themselves, hurting someone else, or being abused, there is an obligation for the AMIAS to take action to protect the Alateen and the group.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
23	<p>I don’t have to report allegations of abuse or neglect because of the principle of anonymity and because I am a volunteer.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
24	<p>The statements listed below are common sense ways to keep the focus on safety during an Alateen meeting and any other time AMIAS interact with Alateens.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transport Alateens in a group and with another adult • Do not transport Alateens without parental permission • Obtain permission/medical care forms when required • Be gender and number conscious • It is suggested that Alateen groups create behavior guidelines so that everyone knows what is expected before, during and after the meeting. <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>

27	<p><i>Because each group is autonomous, you do not need to follow the Area Alateen Safety and Behavioral Requirements Policy and instructions in the training modules. They are only suggestions.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
28	<p>When Alateens bring up difficult situations such as living with physical violence, running away, peer pressure, bullying, abuse, sex and sexuality, suicide, you can use all these tools:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Let the child talk about it. • Suggest a meeting topic to engage the group in general discussion on living with violence or anger. • Talk and seek input from other Alateen Group Sponsors and your Service Sponsor without violating the Alateen’s anonymity. <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
29	<p>When parents ask questions, these are appropriate things you can say or do:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain that Alateen recovery is about learning to keep the focus on oneself, just as Al-Anon members do. • Let them know the safety procedures for the meeting or event. • Explain anonymity. • Give basic pamphlets that explain Alateen to the parent. <p style="text-align: center;">True or False</p>
